New Bible Class Curriculum

Starting in July, the adult class will embark on a 3.5 year curriculum that will study nearly all of God's word. Our teachers will summarize and record at the end of each period both the high and low points of each subject, so that the next time around improvements can be made. We will make a point of keeping our materials available for future classes to use. Good notes and records will be kept. New teachers will be encouraged. All this is in an attempt to help us all be the best stewards we can be of our bible class time together.

Our Sunday morning class in July will appropriately be an Overview of the Bible, to help us kick off our new curriculum and to set the stage for all the studies to come. If you will be a student in the Sunday morning class, please consider purchasing a copy of **Survey of the Bible**, by William Hendriksen. You can obtain them right here in Nashville for about \$22 (see inset), or probably from any one of the several bible bookstores operated by brethren, though I have seen several listing the book as out of print or unavailable. I first used this book in a year-long study of the scriptures when I was in college in Cookeville, and have found it to be a good all-around resource for my library. Because of its length, we won't be using the entire book in our 13-week Overview class, but will pull material from it as appropriate. Consider investing in it yourself for future use in the adult class, as the book will serve as a supplemental reference during other classes in our 3.5 year curriculum. We have bought 10 copies to put in the library for members to check out.

Our exercise in the Overview of the Bible class will be to introduce the timeline that has been purchased for all the classes to use, and to relate the various books of the Bible to that timeline to help us understand the time period both of content and of authorship of the various books, though the timing of the content will be of primary importance. We will try to firmly fix in the minds of all our class members what the general timing of Bible chronology looks like, and give us all a framework into which we may fit our later studies.
